Saying Farewell to Mayor Derk P Timothy

Derk Timothy—Bluffdale City Mayor 2010—2021

As the City's Mayor, Derk has had a tremendous impact on the city. The following list is not designed to be everything, but it does highlight a few of his notable accomplishments.

Porter Rockwell Boulevard - His number 1 priority. He moved the design location to maximize Economic Development by purchasing 1.5 Acres in Herriman and Purchased the Corridor in Bluffdale from McDougal, DAI and Independence. He received just under \$10 million for the Corridor Preservation Fund, applied for and received fundings of \$8 million, \$7 million, \$6 million for various sections of PRB and \$26 million for the Bridge.

Roads - Mayor Timothy worked with Council to ensure that the city streets were put on a maintenance plan and that all of them are kept at a Road Surface Life of over 15 years.

Bangerter Overpass - He worked with UDOT to get the Bangerter Overpass at Redwood Road.

Schools - He helped negotiate approval of the Summit Academy High School and two of their Elementaries, worked with Jordan School District to get a second Elementary and a Junior High School.

Served on and Chaired many important Committees - Council of Government, Council of Mayors, South Valley Sewer Board, Wasatch Front Regional Council, MIDA, etc.

Parks - Four Major Parks were built during Mayor Timothy's terms. Parry Farms, Vintage, and 2 in Independence. The new Day Ranch Park is underway.

Town Days/Old West Days - Championed the expansion and continuation of our Town's Celebrations.

Reinstituted the Bluffdale Arts Advisory Board - supported them in funding and in attendance.

Established Citizen Committees - Police, Traffic, City Hall location, Rodeo etc. He negotiated the contract with Saratoga Springs for Police and interviewed and recommended many Planning Commission Members.

City Hall - Championed and aided in design and construction. Number 1 Drone Pilot/Documentarian. In 2017 he was able to move in to his first Mayor's Office that wasn't just his backpack. Received \$300K plus in Solar Grants. These City building systems will continue to benefit the city for decades.

Utah Data Center - This added a great deal of city infrastructure, miles of pipe trunkline, two pump stations, two water storage tanks and more miles of secondary water trunkline.

Meet the Mayor - He set aside regular times to meet with Citizens to hear their concerns and ideas.

Public Works Building - He laid groundwork for a new Public Works facility.

Fire Station #2 - He championed the design, construction, and staffing of a new fire station.

Lights at the Trestle - He replaced stop signs with signals at the rail road trestle as well as a height detection system.

For all his hard work and dedication to the City of Bluffdale, we are grateful and will greatly miss him .
