Mayor's Message



What do you know about our State Legislature? I want to give an overview of how our State Legislature works and what they do for us.

When does the Legislature meet?

The Utah Legislative General Session begins the 1st Tuesday after the 3rd Monday in January. It ends 45 days later (excluding Federal holidays). This year it runs January 18-March 4.

What House and Senate district is Bluffdale in?

Currently, Bluffdale is in House District 41 and Senate District 11. Redistricting happens every 10 years after a census. Our new districts will be in affect for the 2022 elections and go into effect on January 1, 2023. We will now be in two House Districts. District 46 is roughly East of Redwood and South of 14600 South. District 47 is the rest of Bluffdale. Our new Senate District will be 18.

Currently, Bluffdale is in House District 41 and Senate District 11. Redistricting happens every 10 years after a census. Our new districts will be in affect for the 2022 elections and go into effect on January 1, 2023. We will now be in two House Districts. District 46

Who are our elected officials in the Legislature?

Both Mark Strong and Dan McCay encourage us to reach out to them. You can email them at mstrong@le.Utah.gov and dmccay@le.Utah.gov When you email them, you must put in your subject line "Bluffdale Constituent." They receive hundreds of emails every day and want to try and respond to those they serve.

What if I am interested in taking a tour of the Capitol?

If you would like to visit the State Capitol during the session, reach out to them to see if they are available. They would love to see you. You can also schedule a tour of the Capitol by visiting <https://utahstatecapitol.utah.gov/visitors-tours/schedule-a-tour>

How can I stay informed about bills that could impact me, my business and community?

The best resource to learn more about this Legislative session is the website <https://le.utah.gov/> The first thing I suggest you do is create an account. By doing this, you can track the bills, committees and other subjects you are interested in.

I would also click on the tab at the bottom "Resources" where you can play live streaming of meetings, see the floor/Reading calendar, view agendas, see the legislator bill request (how many bills each legislator is working on) and more.

One of the main responsibilities of our legislature is to create and approve the State budget. If you go to the website <https://le.utah.gov/> and click on "Budget" (at the top) then click on "Quick Facts" there is an overview of what the State Budget looks like.

How does a bill become as law in Utah?

In 2021 502 bills were passed at the Utah Legislature. Did you know a bill has to have 6 readings? 3 in the House and 3 in the Senate. Did you know there is an entire office that does the technical writing of the bills? This is from <https://le.utah.gov/> on how a bill becomes law in Utah.

An Idea Is Developed. A legislator draws from various sources in deciding what should be introduced in the Legislature as a bill. Ideas come from constituents, government agencies, special interest groups, lobbyists, the Governor, and the legislator.

The Bill is Drafted. The idea is submitted to the Office of Legislative Research and General Counsel, a nonpartisan legislative staff office, in the form of a bill request. The assigned bill drafting attorney reviews existing law, researches the issues, and prepares the bill in proper technical form. The bill is given a number. A fiscal review is conducted and a "Fiscal Note" is attached. The bill is also reviewed for statutory or constitutional concerns.

The Bill is Introduced. The bill is introduced into the Legislature and referred to the Rules Committee.

The Bill Receives Standing Committee Review and Public Input. The Rules Committee recommends to the presiding officer the standing committee to which the bill should be referred. The standing committee, in an open meeting, reviews the bill and receives public testimony. The committee may amend, hold, table, substitute, or make a favorable recommendation on the bill.

The Bill Is Returned to the Floor. Following the committee hearing the bill is returned to the full house with a committee report. The committee reports the bill out favorably, favorably with amendments, substituted, or that the bill has been tabled.

The Bill is Debated in Open Session. The bill is debated in open session. During floor debate, the bill can be amended or substituted. It can be held (circled). In order for a bill to pass the House of Representatives, it must receive at least 38 votes. The bill must receive at least 15 votes in the Senate in order to pass.

The Bill Passes Both Houses in the Legislature. After the bill has gone through both houses, it is signed by both presiding officers (the Senate President and the Speaker of the House).

The Bill is Prepared for the Governor's Action. The Office of Legislative Research and General Counsel prepares the bill in final form. This is called the "enrolled" bill.

The Bill Receives the Governor's Action. The enrolled bill is sent to the Governor for his action. He can either sign the bill, veto it, or allow it become law without his signature.

The Bill Becomes Effective. A bill enacted by the Legislature is effective 60 days following adjournment, unless another date is specified in the bill. It then becomes law.

I encourage you to learn a little more about how our legislative system works. Talk about it with your kids and your



neighbors, visit the State Capitol and create an account to track the bills. I will also be at the Capitol a couple of days a week during the session. Please reach out to me with any questions or help in understanding local government nhall@bluffdale.com Our representatives Dan McCay and Mark Strong will be holding a Town Hall meeting to answer questions and review the session. We will make sure to let everyone know when and where they will be held. Let's continue to work together to keep our community safe and watch the bills that are being proposed and passed.

Get Your Pet Ready for a New Year

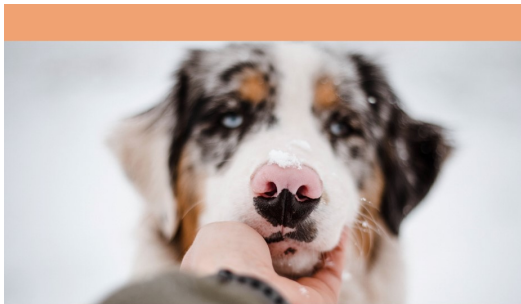
Did you get a pet this holiday season? Or did vaccinating or licensing your pet in 2021 slip your mind? Here's a few things to get your pet ready for the new year.

VACCINATE: Make sure they are up to date on vaccinations. Pet illnesses and diseases are preventable if you vaccinate your pet.

MICROCHIP: At Salt Lake County Animal Services, any pet in Salt Lake County with a current pet license can receive a FREE microchip with proof of license. You can walk in with your pet during our open hours for this service, no appointment necessary. Questions? Email animal@slco.org.

LICENSE: By Utah state law, pet owners must license a pet by the time they are five months of age or within 30 days of moving into an area or acquiring the pet. Find out more about licensing on our website.

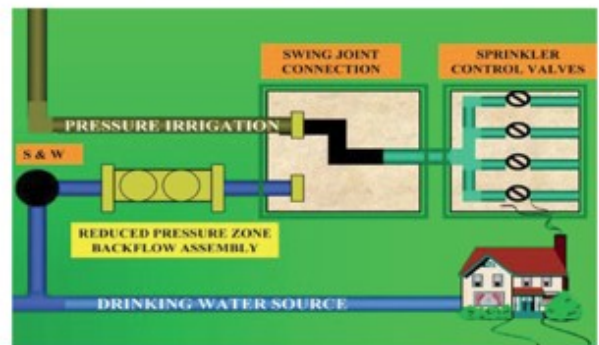
Landscape Sprinkling System

The Plumbing Code requires that all landscape sprinkling systems connected to the public drinking water system be equipped with an approved backflow

prevention device or assembly. Land-scape irrigation systems could subject the drinking water supplies to things such as fertilizers, pesticides and animal waste.



Any sprinkling system that can utilize both public drinking water supplies and secondary water supplies must follow specific plumbing regulations to prevent raw water from entering the drinking water system! Please contact your local drinking water supplier for specific requirements regarding landscape irrigation systems and which type of backflow prevention is appropriate for your landscape irrigation system. Call your local public drinking water agency or plumbing inspector regarding cross connection control and backflow prevention requirements in your area.
