Arts Advisory Board

Senior Center

The Riverton Senior Center is a joint effort between the City of Riverton, Herriman, Bluffdale and Salt Lake County Aging & Adult Services. The Center offers a comprehensive range of programs to enlighten, educate and enrich the lives of adults age 60 and over.

Traffic Control Committee

Evaluates traffic trends and use measurements to decide how different signage affects traffic, how data can help enforcement, and what policies will be most beneficial to the City. They are responsible for placement and collection of the data from the City-owned speed trailer. They offer recommendations to the City Council on how to improve traffic flow in the City.

Youth Council

Residents ages 14-18 are encouraged to apply for the Youth Council. Responsibilities include: actively participate in meetings; attend some of the City Council meetings; participate in Youth Day at the Legislature; plan and participate in service projects; assist with Old West Days and other City events.

Juneteenth History and Celebration Schedule

Celebrated on June 19 every year, Juneteenth celebrates the end of slavery in the United States. Over the last 150 years, it has also become a chance to celebrate African-American culture as well. On June 19, 1865, federal troops arrived in Galveston, Texas and marched throughout the city reading General Order No. 3, which stated that all slaves were free. President Joe Biden

Rise Virtual Academy

Juneteenth is a celebration of the end of slavery and a chance to uplift others who are oppressed. The City Council voted to award construction of the Day Ranch Park in the meeting on May 25. That means construction can begin. Watch our social media accounts for information about when we will break ground for construction. Playground equipment for the All-Abilities section has been ordered.



Traffic Control Committee

In January of this year, Mayor Hall officially commissioned the Citizen Traffic Committee whose charter is to field complaints/concerns, analyze and make recommendations to the city based on the findings of the committee. Considering that speeding is the most common complaint, the mayor has requested that the traffic committee employ the use of the speed trailer to gather data in the locations that receive the most complaints. It is up to the committee's discretion to determine the feasibility and exact placement of the trailer.

We are currently running a 2-phase, 4 part study along Porter Rockwell Blvd (PRB). The purpose of these stages was primarily to understand the ways in which the different modes of the trailer can affect behavior. PRB was selected because of the relatively low number non-residential drivers with consistent daily driving patterns week over week. The secondary purpose of the study was to get a control dataset of the driving behavior along PRB that can be compared to changes that are imminent with the completion of the PRB Bridge.

Be the best pet owner, and keep your dog cool this summer!

Hot Cars: Once outside temperatures reach 70-degrees, temperatures in a car can exceed 116-degrees within 10 minutes. Even on a mild 75-degree day, cracking a window in your car or parking in the shade doesn't make a difference. Temperatures inside the vehicle are deadly. Dogs can suffer from heatstroke, irreparable brain damage, or even death.

Hot Pavement: Dogs can burn their paws on the sidewalk in the summer. When in doubt test the surface yourself: place the back of your hand on the pavement. If you CAN'T stand the heat for FIVE seconds, it's too hot for you to walk your dog. Walk your dog early in the morning, later in the evening, and leave them at home when heading to festivals or farmer's markets.

Hot Balconies: Despite being covered, a balcony can get very hot, VERY fast. A dog left on a balcony may try to escape and injure themselves when they're left

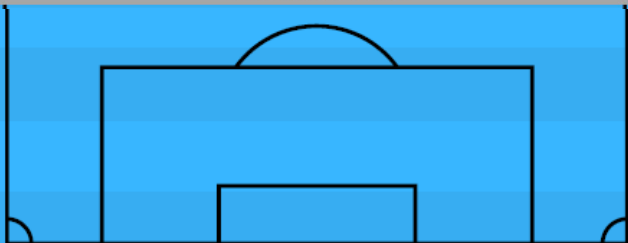
alone and hot. A bowl of water is easily overturned, and the pet is left anxious, dehydrated, and in similar conditions as a hot car.

If you see a pet inside a vehicle or on a balcony, excessively panting, non-responsive, drooling, or listless, call Salt Lake County Animal Service's Dispatch number immediately: 801-840-4000. Never break a window of a vehicle on your own to pull out a pet, you could be liable for damages. Take a photo of the pet, the license plate, and give that information to Animal Control Officers. Drought Resiliency - Daniel Tracer, Assistant City Engineer

Bluffdale City receives all of our drinking water from Jordan Valley Water Conservancy District which diverts water from the upper Provo River and Uintah Mountains. While this winter's snowpack was 90% of average, last year's low precipitation means we have a lot of catching up to do in order to fill our reservoirs. Jordanelle is currently at 67% capacity and Deer Creek is at 83%, which is why we're asking our citizens to voluntarily reduce their drinking water usage by 10% to match Jordan Valley's recommendations.

You can help achieve this goal by:

- Limit outdoor watering to no more than 2x per week
- Find and Repair any water leaks.
- Replace old toilets with stronger, lower water using models. (<https://utahwatersavers.com/Program/4/toilet>)
- Avoid watering during the day, when its raining, or windy.
- Raise your lawn mower blade to 3-4". Taller grass can shade your soil and preserve moisture.

With everyone's efforts, we can make our water supply more drought resilient!

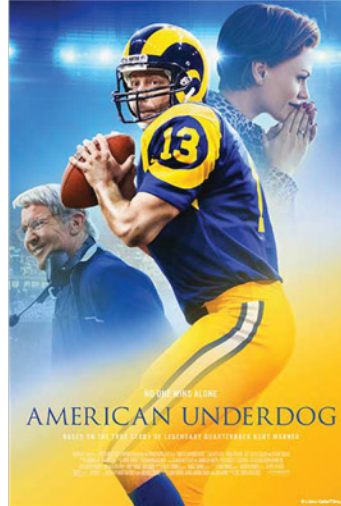

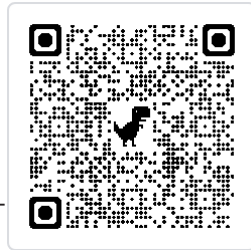
