## MAYOR'S MESSAGE



This month, I have really been thinking about our water situation. A city has many functions, but providing water is one of the most important.

The city builds the infrastructure for both drinking water and for secondary water and provides that water.

### Utah is having a record snowpack year! What does this mean for Bluffdale?

Bluffdale City purchases all our drinking water from Jordan Valley Water Conservancy District (JVWCD). Through the Central Utah Project, they bring water from the Wasatch and Uinta Mountains, store it in Jordanelle and Deer Creek Reservoirs before it is treated and delivered to our system.

The watershed draining to these reservoirs is currently sitting at almost 200% of normal snowpack.

This is a step in the right direction, but one snowy winter won't end our 20 year long drought. We are asking for your help in conserving our water to keep our reservoirs full. Any water that we don't use is either stored in Jordanelle and Deer Creek or goes to Utah lake and then the Great Salt Lake, which has reached its lowest levels in 40 years. Your efforts in conserving water are a great way to raise our lakes and reservoirs.

Nearly all the irrigation water used in the City comes from canals that are fed by Utah Lake. By reducing your watering, you can help Utah Lake and the Great Salt Lake recover from our drought as well.

### How Does the City Conserve Water?

- With Jordan Valley Water Conservancy District (JVWCD) we purchased WeatherTRAK controllers for City parks. With a grant, we increased the number of controllers from 5 to 17. Once installed, there was an instant reduction of 3 million gallons.
- Bluffdale uses smart secondary water filters which constantly monitor inlet and outlet pressures preventing water waste by only flushing when necessary.

- Ongoing water-wise landscaping projects: Vintage Park, Independence Park, Independence Trail network, Porter Rockwell Boulevard trail network.
- Retrofitting all existing City Park irrigation systems to monitor and water only when soil conditions dictate.
- Requiring all new development to treat and infiltrate storm water to recharge the ground water aquifer.
- Requiring all new developments to have water efficient landscaping, reviewed by City Engineers, to include drip irrigation systems, no more 35% grass, and no grass in park strips or slopes.
- Constructing a pump station to reuse South Valley Sewer District effluent water for irrigation.
- Reusing effluent water from Utah Data Center to water the City's main park.
- Continuing to use grants to remove grass in non-recreation areas.
- Installing meters on all secondary water connections in the city in the next 3 years, estimated 687 connections.

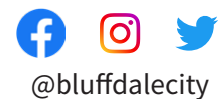

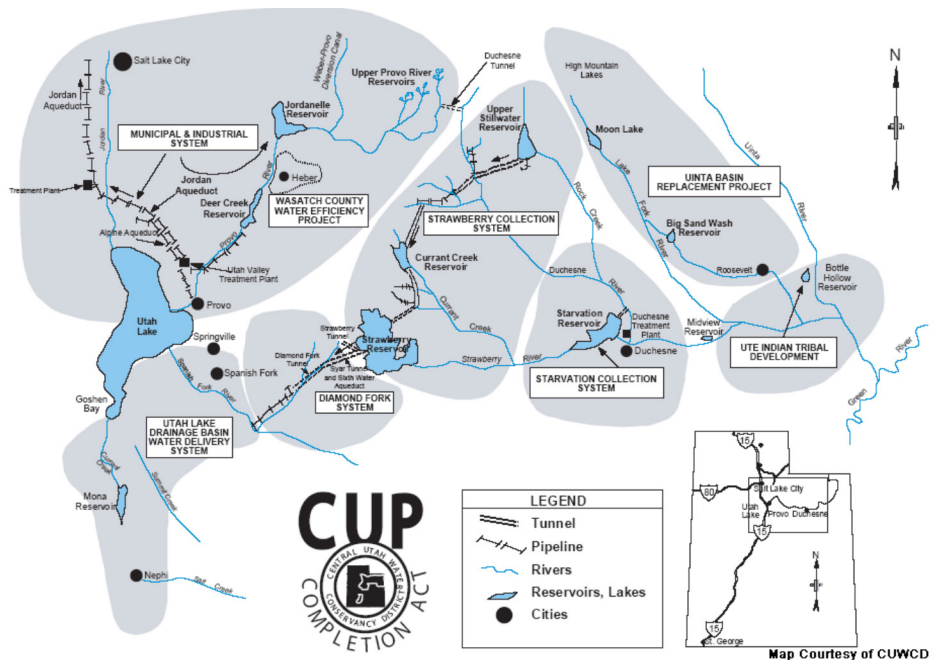
### We all live Downstream!

We hear a lot about water conservation (both drinking water and secondary water) but I love the campaign “we all live downstream.” Everything that goes down our storm drain ends up in our ponds, streams, lakes, and rivers. Dumping something into the gutter is no different than dumping it into the nearest creek. Dumping anything other than clean water into the storm drain system is illegal. If you have a concern, please call the Health Department right away! The emergency number is 385-468-8888 (option 8). They answer environmental emergency calls 24/7 every day of the year. All reports are confidential.

Also a fun activity is to take your kids out and have them identify your neighborhood storm drain and drains all around our city as you drive around.

- Make sure grass clippings, leaves, and other debris does not end up in your gutter.
- Wash your car on the lawn or at a commercial car wash.
- Pick up pet waste and put it in the trash.
- Don't spray off your driveway or sidewalk-sweep or blow it into your lawn.
- Target fertilizers and pesticides to the lawn and garden.
- Dispose of paint, chemicals, and automotive fluids properly.

Let's continue to work together to be wise stewards of our water and our water systems. I love to tell people, when you turn on your water and water comes out, it is because of the hard work of City Staff.



The Central Utah Project (CUP) is a system containing a vast network of reservoirs, aqueducts, tunnels and canals, pipelines, pumping plants and conveyance facilities that develop water for irrigation, municipal and industrial use and power production. ## ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT HAPPENINGS

We are excited to see much economic development activity in several key areas of the City and within multiple sectors of the economy. Commercial activity is increasing at The Ranch (Bangerter and Redwood), Wardle Business Park (2700 West and Bangerter), Porter Rockwell Commercial (Redwood and Porter Rockwell), Rockwell Ridge Business Park (Porter Rockwell and Bluffdale Blvd (14600 S)), Bringham Station (South Redwood Rd), within Mountain View Business Park (Bluffdale Blvd), along with our historical industrial park near Bluffdale Blvd and Heritagecrest Way where the recent additions of Covent Garden and Marble Arch flex spaces can be found.



Leads, proposals, ideas, and submittals come through the City's Planning, Building, and Economic Development offices daily. It is very dynamic and cannot be fully captured in this article. Although many leads don't come to fruition, the generation of ideas does ultimately bring projects and shovels in the ground for the community to utilize.

Multiple new food and entertainment establishments have now taken root or are expressing interest in Bluffdale locations, such as: Toro Ramen, Bout Time Pub and Grub, FatCats, Zupas, Costa Vida, Royal Coffee, and Swig with many other leads developing. Many service-related businesses are working on site plans right now, such as: Holiday Oil, 7-11, Quick Quack, Wiggy Wash, MWVS Veterinary Hospital, an orthodontist, and

a small medical center. New commercial flex spaces offering employment opportunities have been approved and are in progress along 2700 West (Saddle Back) and 14000 S (Brubaker Development) which will offer many opportunities for business services locations. A 170,000 square foot addition to our burgeoning data center industry was recently opened along Pony Express Road. 200,000 square feet of business and distribution are currently developing in the Mountain View Business Park.

The City Council has recently approved new zoning for two mixed use projects – combining commercial and residential housing – along Porter Rockwell Boulevard. One - the Centrum - is located at Bluffdale Boulevard and Porter Rockwell Boulevard, just south of The Point. The second is also on Porter Rockwell, near the Jordan River – The Bluffs at Point Crossing. Leasing discussions related to these developments are generating interest along the newly opened highway. The recent completion of the Porter Rockwell Bridge over the Jordan River and the State of Utah's investment in the Point have been substantial catalysts for development inquiries in this area. The City has also acquired property near Bangerter and Redwood to make available for commercial development opportunities and is currently in leasing discussions with several potential users. The City's infrastructure and property investment is setting the stage for the future.

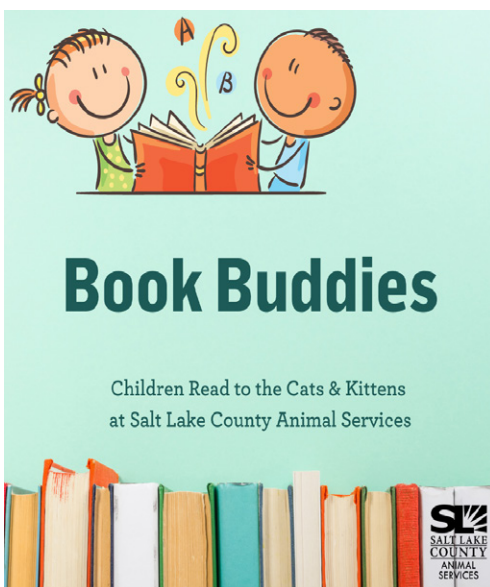

4. Sign in and sign out on the clipboard in the cattery. This is logged as volunteer time!

The program will help children improve their reading skills AND will help the shelter pets with socialization. Animals find the rhythmic sounds of a voice very soothing. Similar programs at other shelters across the country have seen the benefits the program has to offer.


