## MAYOR'S MESSAGE



Election season is upon us and this year, our Bluffdale Municipal Elections will be held to elect three city council members.

Our six-member council is the governing body for Bluffdale City and is composed of the mayor and five council members. It is helpful to understand our form of government as we approach the filing date for these positions.

Each seat on the City Council is at-large, meaning that council members represent the entire city rather than specific districts or areas. The terms for these seats are 4 years long and are staggered to ensure that not all elected officials' terms expire at the same time, meaning there will be 3 elected in 2023 and 3 positions in 2025.

Bluffdale has, by ordinance, a City Manager who oversees the operational and day-to-day responsibilities

of managing the city, its employees, and services. The City Manager, a professional full-time role, oversees all City departments and reports directly to both the Mayor and the City Council.

The City Council members have many responsibilities and expectations as they serve. Some of these responsibilities are:

- Adopt Annual Budgets
- Adopt Ordinances
- Create Long-Range Plans for City Services and Utilities
- Establish City Fees
- Pass Resolutions
- Regulate Zoning and Land Development
- Oversee the Provision of Numerous Other City Services

The City Council conducts business by:

- Making motions
- Passing ordinances and resolutions
- Taking official action by vote at the Bluffdale City Council meeting (held generally on the

second and fourth calendar Wednesday of each month)

The council also has a responsibility to read the packet of information BEFORE the meeting, ask questions from staff, and speak to the public to understand all of the issues before the meeting. This can take hours and even days to come to a meeting prepared.

Council members are also expected to attend government training, attend conferences, sit on various boards, and attend city events. They spend time talking with residents about concerns and then bring the concerns to City Staff.

If you are interested in becoming a candidate you must file a Declaration of Candidacy in person with the City Recorder from June 1 -June 7, 2023. Please bring your photo ID when you come to declare candidacy and be prepared to sign the documents and receive instructions with the City Recorder. Your family is welcome to attend with you!

To be eligible to run for a municipal office, one must meet certain qualifications, including being a citizen of the United States, a registered voter, and a resident of Bluffdale for the 12

## SALT LAKE COUNTY ANIMAL SERVICES

Spring is here and it's time for you and your pup to roam the neighborhood, the parks, and the trails. Before you bound out of the house grab a leash and those poop bags.

### Leash Laws

Many violators of this ordinance will claim that they're pet is friendly, or less aggressive when on leash. But Salt Lake County Animal Services would remind you not everyone likes a "friendly" off-leash dog, nor do other dogs that are on leash. A leash is not an optional accessory, it's the LAW to wear one. If you and your dog are caught being off-leash, and it's not a designated off-leash dog park, you will get a ticket and will pay a fine.

### Pack Out the Poo

It's the law to clean up after your dog, if you get caught not picking up their poop, expect to pay a fine. This is another public nuisance violation. Be a considerate neighbor or hiker and carry poop bags to clean-up after your dog when they defecate out on an adventure, whether it's in the neighborhood or on a busy hiking trail, you must pick it up.

# 2023 ELECTION



The City of Bluffdale 2023 Municipal General Election will be held to elect three City Council Members. Each Council seat is at-large for a 4-year term. A person seeking to become a candidate for municipal office shall file a Declaration of Candidacy, in person with the Bluffdale City Recorder, 2222 West 14400 South, Bluffdale Utah, during the office hours of 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and not later than the close of those office hours, between June 1 and June 7, 2023 (excluding Saturday and Sunday). An individual who cannot appear in person may declare candidacy by following the provisions of Utah Code § 20A-9-203.

To qualify as a candidate for a municipal office, you must be a United States citizen, a registered voter in the municipality in which the individual is elected, a resident of Bluffdale for 12 consecutive months immediately before the date of the election and may not be convicted of a felony. The Primary Election, if needed, will be held Tuesday, August 15, 2023. The General Election will be held Tuesday, November 7, 2023.

## ORDINANCE HIGHLIGHT: WEEDS

Hopefully, this month there will be more warm days than days with snow on the ground and we are able to spend more time in our yards and gardens. To ensure that our community remains safe and visually appealing, we are reminding everyone of the city ordinance that requires all residents to keep their property free of noxious weeds.



Ordinance 11.300.020 Section D states that any weeds that are over eight inches tall, located within thirty feet of a structure or within five feet of a public street's outer edge, or in any other location that may pose a fire hazard, will be considered noxious weeds. It is important for property owners to maintain their yards to avoid any safety concerns and keep Bluffdale looking beautiful.

We all have a responsibility to keep Bluffdale safe and attractive, so let's do our part in keeping our community weed-free. If you have any questions regarding the noxious weed ordinance, please contact the city at (801) 254-2200 or you can find the ordinance on the website.

## CITY BUDGET UPDATE

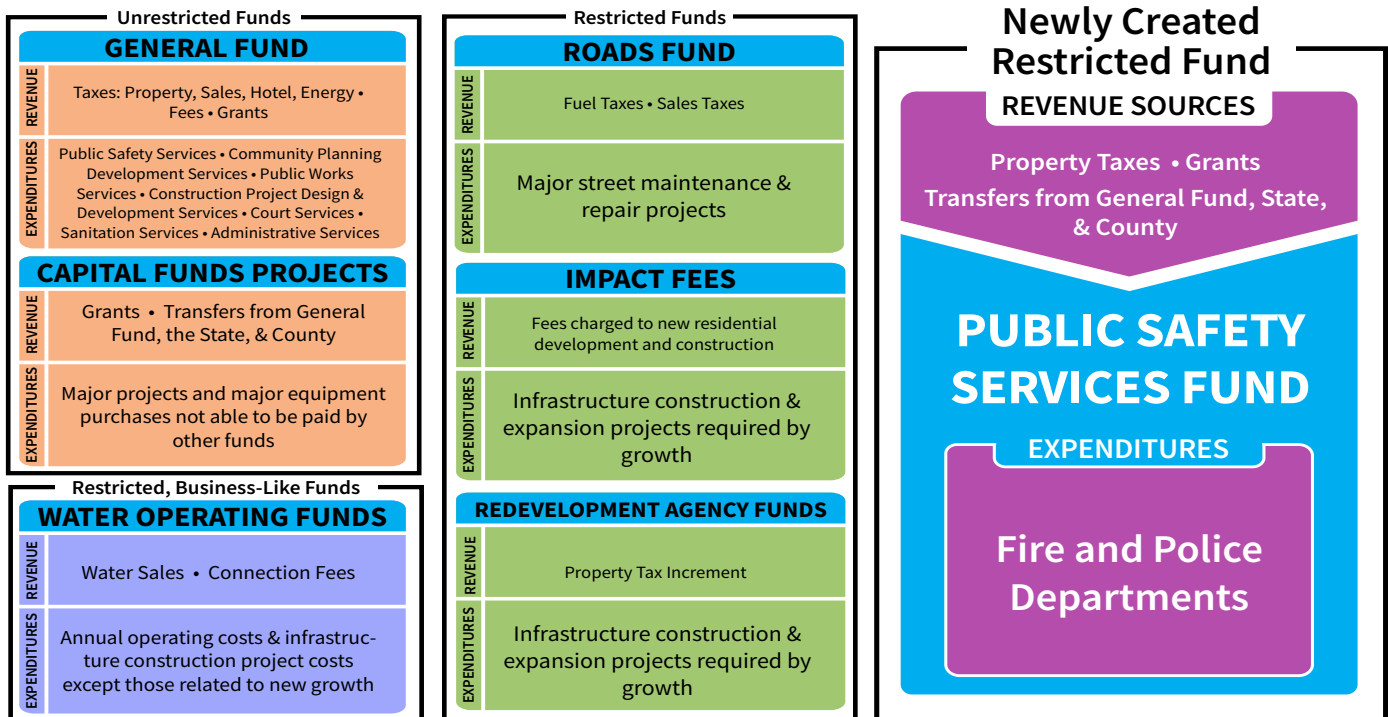
The City Council passed a tentative budget for fiscal year 2024 at their April 26 Council Meeting. This tentative budget will continue to be discussed and modified during the next few meetings. A final budget is scheduled to be approved on June 14. The detailed budget is available for review on the City’s website at <https://www.bluffdale.com/Tentative-Budget>.

The following items are some of the highlights of this year’s budget:

- The law enforcement department and fire department have been moved into a new governmental fund called the Public Safety Services Fund.
- The City will be able to levy property taxes that can only be used in this fund.
- The tentative budget includes a proposed property tax levy in the Public Safety Services Fund that will raise \$520,400 to be used exclusively by the police and fire departments. The tax increase is needed to pay for changing two of our six positions in the fire department from part-time to full-time as well as provide for annual COLA adjustments. The increase is also needed to pay for market driven pay increases, promotions, and standard step increases for the police department.
- Our major budget challenge this year is addressing a projected reduction in General Fund revenue of almost \$400,000. This is the Fund that pays the costs of the bulk of our city services. This revenue reduction and the impact of continuing high inflation are major hurdles for the city.
- As the City population and businesses continue to grow each year, the infrastructure needed to provide water, transportation, parks, etc. also continues to grow. Additional Public Works personnel positions have been added in the budget to provide additional manpower to maintain the additional city assets.
- The 20-acre park in the Independence area will be completed.
- Construction on the new Public Works building will begin.




