MAYOR'S MESSAGE



Before the first snow hit, we had a groundbreaking ceremony for the new Bluffdale Public Works Complex. With the growth

in our city, our needs continue to expand.

The current building, where the Public Works department is located, was built in the 1970s. It has not been updated to meet current building codes, the utilities are outdated, and there are concerns regarding earthquake sustainability. The building is on a small piece of

land that does not house all our equipment.

Some of the larger problems we are facing with our current Public Works building is that we cannot wash or maintain our equipment on site. The storm drains are too old so we must drive our vehicles to other cities for the washing, emptying, and maintenance. This becomes very difficult in the winter when we are constantly plowing and salting the roads.

Because there is not room on the property for all of our equipment and vehicles, they are stored outside. They need to be constantly repaired due to deterioration and have been

exposed to theft and vandalism. Another safety concern is the location of the current building on Redwood Road next to the cemetery. The area has become very difficult to enter and exit due to the heavy amounts of traffic, making it high-risk for our employees and assets.

After 10 years of looking at land, making offers, and searching for a solution, we have moved forward with land located on 13800 South and 3600 West next to Bangerter Highway on the Riverton border. This area is about 7 acres with room to house a building and our equipment.

Many have asked how this is to be paid for. Remember that 100% of your property taxes go to the Fire and Police Protection Fund to pay for public safety. Your property taxes will not pay for the public works building. More than half of the building is paid for with money from the Water Operations Fund. The rest of the money comes from sales tax and other funding.

We are thrilled to have this project underway. We hope to have it completed within 18 months. Please reach out with any questions nhall@bluffdale.com as we work together to find solutions to our growing city.

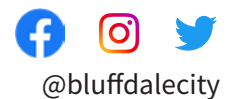

AUDIT AND BUDGET COMMITTEE

Our city continues to grow, and with that growth we make adjustments to improve our operations. As part of those adjustments, we are adding two new committees in the finance area.

The Mayor will be selecting qualified candidates and asking the Council for approval just like our other committees and boards.

The first committee will be the Audit Committee. It will have the following members and responsibilities.

- Three (3) members with a background in finance or accounting.
- Members will be independent, not management.

- The committee will provide independent review and oversight of the City's financial reporting, internal controls, and independent auditors.
- The committee will report the City Council.
- Members may also be on the Budget Review Committee.

The second committee will be the Budget Review Committee. It will have the following members and responsibilities.

- Five (5) to seven (7) members with a background in finance or accounting.
- Not all members of this committee will be independent;

some members of management will also be part of this committee.

- The Committee will review the budget message and the budget document.
- Based on the review, members will ask questions, make comments, and make recommendations to improve and clarify the budget document.

along the Wasatch Front contributes to 10-20% of the particulate pollution on strong inversion days.

Burning wood is hazardous to your health.

Wood smoke can pose a health risk—especially to the people nearest the burning. Wood burning creates fine particles—tiny, microscopic pieces of pollution that can enter your body and cause breathing and heart problems.



Stagnant air conditions during the Wasatch Front's common winter temperature inversions can concentrate wood smoke and other air pollutants close to ground, increasing the likelihood of health problems. Wood smoke can increase your and your neighbors' exposure to cancerous compounds and respiratory irritants.
