In our city, along with spring comes

soccer! I just received the numbers for spring soccer from our recreation department. We have 645 kids signed up and ready to play. Our recreation department is young. It started in 2022 with just 472 players.

There are many wonderful aspects of our city and I believe that our recreation department is one of those things that makes us special. In the fall 2023 Parks, Trails, and Recreation

Survey, residents overwhelmingly agreed that having recreational programs is important for our city. Because of input received from you, we are working to increase the recreational programs offered.




I am excited to announce our growing recreational options. This year we are offering teeball (Pre-K - 2nd grade), spring and fall pickleball leagues and tournaments, flag football (1st-7th grade) and our annual Badlands 5K/10K run along with our spring and fall soccer! Thank you to Skyler Killian, our recreation coordinator. I am grateful for all his



hard work coordinating logistics for each activity. Our Parks Department also works hard to make sure our parks and courts are play ready.

It takes all of us working together to make these sports a reality. Each time we have teams face off

SPRING HAS SPRUNG FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

As we hop into 2024, there is much new economic development growth to report. Construction has continued over the winter on several key sites with two convenience stores approaching completion: 7-11 on Redwood Road and Holiday Oil on Porter Rockwell Boulevard. Quick Quack is ready for customers with a ribbon cutting ceremony on April 30. There will soon be a hospital for our pet family members on 2700 West and Bangerter Highway.

The City owns property for commercial development on Redwood Road north of Maverik and is now accepting exciting offers for restaurants and other commercial uses – announcements forthcoming! The City is constructing an access road connecting north from Maverik to 13800 South in 2024 to facilitate this. The creation of road frontage is an important attribute to successful commercial pad development and increases value.

A zoning application is in process for the old Maverik site on 14400 South which could bring an auto parts store to the community. Another zoning application is looking to allow a commercial dog boarding and kennel facility in the 2700 West commercial area.

If you are craving pizza, please visit the Little Caesars on Redwood Road and quench your thirst nearby at Swig (soon to open in 2024). Starbucks is under construction on Porter Rockwell Boulevard and 14600 South, bringing in a commercial business before the residential in the Centrum mixed use project.

Across from the Centrum in Rockwell Ridge is the new SunKisst full-service salon. Services there, including modern tanning beds, can get you beach ready for the summer!

Early childhood education opportunities will be available this year at the Everbrook Academy on 2700 West and 13900 South.

Tenant spaces in all the commercial and industrial flex spaces throughout Bluffdale are filling up with a diverse mix of businesses and employment opportunities and new flex projects are in the queue in east Bluffdale. These areas provide leasing and purchase opportunities and serve as great incubator spaces.

A parting thought for the community: What will The Point development, the completion of 14600 South bridge and road widening, and a new FrontRunner station bring for the future of Bluffdale's economic development? 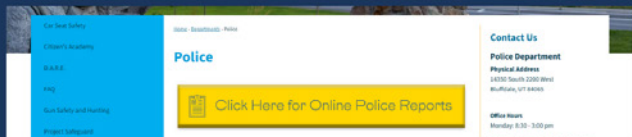

ROAD CONSTRUCTION UPDATES

Rail Road Crossing at 14600 South

RL Wadsworth (RWL) has nearly completed the preliminary phase of the 14600 South Railroad Crossing Project. This is quite a step forward in the project that eventually will connect the 14600 South with four lanes under the railroad tracks. Soon the contractor will start backfilling the box around the sides. The top will become a rideable surface that will connect with the box that will be pushed under the railroad tracks. Next, RWL will place the clay liner that will connect the new box culvert to the existing canal. Once this operation is complete, the temporary traffic lights will be removed until the fall and normal traffic patterns can resume.

During the summer months and into the fall, preparations will continue in the area. It is anticipated that during this time the construction work will not affect traffic in this area.

The final stage of the project is scheduled to begin in Fall 2024 and to take 4 - 8 months. This operation will be more demanding and may cause longer delays and more disruptions to the traffic patterns. At times, the area may need to be closed on weekends to accommodate building the new road.

14400 South Construction Project

SEWER, CULINARY WATER, SECONDARY WATER & STORM WATER WORK NOW UNDERWAY

The pipe line upgrade phase of construction began the week of March 25, 2024. This work will upsize the sewer line, replace the culinary water line, upgrade irrigation lines, and install portions of storm drain along 14400 South. Pipe line work is anticipated to be complete early 2025.

- Sewer line work will occur first, beginning at 2200 West, moving toward 3600 West.
- Culinary water line work is anticipated to begin a few weeks after the sewer line followed by irrigation line upgrades and storm drain installation.
- The majority of the sewer line upsizing work will occur on the south side of 14400 South.
- Most culinary water, irrigation, and storm drain work will occur on the north side of 14400 South.



Anticipated Impacts:

- Traffic will be shifted around the active work zones. One-way traffic is possible during daytime hours and will be directed by flaggers or temporary signals.
- Traffic may shift between the north and south sides of the road depending on location of work.
- Traffic may be directed to areas without asphalt. Please obey all speed limits signs and drive cautiously to avoid vehicle damage.
- A temporary sewer bypass will be in place while work is underway. The bypass may be above ground in sections. Where the bypass crosses driveways, ramps or gravel will be used to maintain access.
- Temporary sewer and water service interruptions should be expected when crews connect the bypass pipe and when connections are restored to the new pipe lines. Residents will be notified 48-hours in advance of any service interruptions.
- Some segments of curb, gutter and sidewalk will be removed and replaced along 14400 South.

THE POINT DEVELOPMENT

- Tens of thousands of Utahns have helped shape a vision for The Point that includes a future-focused, multimodal transportation system.
- The Point will be a walkable community that minimizes car dependence, reduces congestion, improves air quality and facilitates unprecedented access to high-quality jobs and educational opportunities.

- Connecting The Point to the regional transit system will be critical to improving Utahns' mobility around the point of the mountain area and across the entire region. The Utah State Legislature has appropriated \$250 million for the FrontRunner Point Improvements project. The project would add a new FrontRunner station near The Point in Bluffdale and additional double track sections in strategic areas along the rail line to improve service system wide.

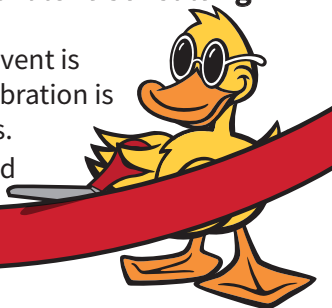
BLUFFDALE BUSINESS BUZZ

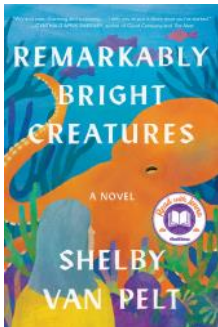
