I am very excited for Bluffdale Old West Days® this year! We have a lot of old traditions and some

new ones too. One tradition that I love is our parade. This year, 14400 South will be under construction and will be a dirt road (this makes it more authentic) and will be closed. There will be a lot of parking and a hayride shuttle available (see inside the newsletter for more details). The parade route has also been altered because of construction. The parade route will be along 2200 West this year. There is a map on the website and in the newsletter with parking options and instructions. Look for my friends Gene and Janice Wright who are the Grand Marshalls, the Bluffdale float, the High School band and so much more!

Another tradition that I love is our rodeo. Every year it sells out. This year, as we are rebuilding the arena, we will not be able to hold the rodeo. I look forward to having new bleachers and bathrooms and a big

There will be a free art project for the kids, games, bingo, entertainment (see website for details) and more. I would love to see everyone bring their chairs, blankets and coolers and hang out all day. Saturday evening, starting at 5 PM, the concert begins. The headliner, Crazy Coyote starts at 7 PM and they will be also calling out line dancing!

To end our big week and to celebrate our amazing community, the firework show will begin around 9:45 at Bluffdale City Park. So many people have worked together to make this celebration possible. The city is fortunate to have 11 full-time professional and exceptional employees as well as 7 hard-working seasonal employees working every

day to deliver high-quality experiences and opportunities and keep our parks and trails clean, safe, welcoming, inclusive and ready to use. When you see them in the parks or along the trails, say “hello” and let them know of any concerns or give a simple expression of appreciation for all their daily efforts in maintaining these amazing places in our city.

The city is growing our recreation programming reflective of the desires of citizens and based on results of a survey conducted in the fall of 2023. In 2022, youth soccer began and has now grown to over 648 participants this year for our spring session. Tee Ball was added as well as an adult Pickleball league and tournament later this summer. We are looking forward to adding more sports programs in the future with continued growth and community support.

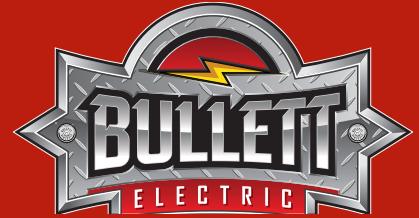

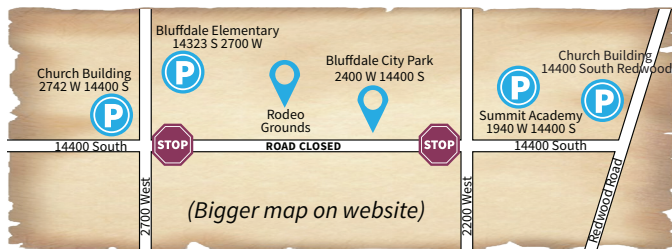

Gene grew up in Twin Falls and Boise, Idaho and moved to Utah in 1973 to finish his B.S. degree in Geology at the University of Utah. Gene graduated from the U of U in 1974. Janice grew up in Magna, Utah and attended the U of U. They met while both were working at the U.S. Geological Survey in 1975 and were married the same year. Gene then worked as a geologist for Getty Mining Company for 10 years. After GMC, he worked as a geologist and manager for 30 years with Engineering Science, Inc. and the Parsons Corporation, an international engineering firm that acquired ESI. Gene retired in 2015. After getting married, Janice became a full time “domestic engineer” (mother) and excelled in raising three successful children while Gene was traveling out of town. They have been married for 49 years.

Both Janice and Gene volunteered to help youth. Janice was a volunteer for the Boy Scouts of America Great Salt Lake Council and held Unit, District, and Council positions at the same time. Gene also held Unit and District positions. They served for a combined period of over 40 years.

Gene and Janice moved to Bluffdale in 2000 where they built their home. They started helping with Bluffdale



Town Days and participated in Trunk or Treat and Christmas Parades for many years. They were asked to be Emergency Management Section Leaders in 2010 and are still serving in this capacity. Prior to 2010 they were Community Emergency Response Team trained and helped with CERT drills. They presented sanitation information during Bluffdale Shake Out and Love Where You Live Events. Gene has been an active HAM radio operator for emergency communications since 2016.

They have ten grandchildren that Janice has watched through the years and the six younger ones have participated in many Bluffdale holiday events.

A SYMBOL OF REDEMPTION AT THE POINT

The Point of the Mountain State Land Authority (Land Authority) has voted unanimously to advance an application that, if approved, would designate the Chapel by the Wayside as a national historic site. Over the years, the Land Authority has worked with the Utah State Historical Society, the Utah State Historic Preservation Office, Preservation Utah, the Draper Historical Society, and other key stakeholders to solicit input regarding chapel preservation.

The chapel was built by prisoners more than six decades ago after residents of the surrounding communities and religious and civic groups helped to raise money for this place of worship. It stands as a beacon of hope and a symbol of redemption as the site is transformed into Utah's Innovation Community.

The Land Authority is working closely with interested stakeholders to submit a nomination that will be reviewed by the Board of State History. If approved by the Board, the nomination is submitted to the National Park Service for final determination. The process is anticipated to take several months.

PROTECT YOUR PET FROM SUMMER FUN

- More pets go missing in the summer months than any other time of year.
- Make sure they always have on a collar with an ID tag, with up-to-date info. Microchipping your pet is also important, in the event your pet goes missing.

- Watch out for these sounds of summer:

- **Barbecues:** If guests are going to be coming in and out of the front door or back gate, keep your pets in a secure area, or put them in their crate. An unsecured gate, or door left open, is the perfect opportunity for your pet to take themselves on an adventure without you.

- **Thunderstorms:** According to the ASPCA, 1 in 5 pets goes missing after being scared by loud noises. Be sure to bring your pet indoors and keep them away from open windows when summer storms roll into your area.

- **Fireworks:** The loud noise of firework displays, big or small, are scary and disorienting to pets. Leave them at home, inside with a loud fan, or calming music. If the fireworks



display is in your driveway, be sure to clean up the leftover firework debris, never underestimate what your dog may stick in its mouth. Fireworks are poisonous to pets.

All pets in Salt Lake County can receive a free microchip at Salt Lake County Animal Services. We welcome you to bring in your pet to Animal Services at 511 W 3900 S, Tue – Sat, 10 AM -6 PM to get your pet microchipped.

Find a lost pet? Contact your local animal control! The first-place pet owners look for a lost pet is the local shelter. How you can help: post a photo of them, where you found them and what shelter they went to on the NextDoor App or Utah Lost & Found Pets Facebook Group. 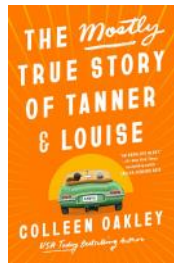
