MAYOR'S MESSAGE



This holiday season, if you are like me, you are looking for gifts for your family, friends and neighbors. I would encourage you to consider

giving yourself and those you love the gift of preparedness. Before my position as Mayor, I spent many years as a volunteer and then as a staff member learning, promoting and teaching about personal preparedness for all emergency situations.

Bluffdale has wonderful resources to help you meet your goals. Often people ask me where they should start. I always tell them water. Water storage is essential. I like to break preparedness into sections, making it simpler to decide where to focus my efforts. Then when one area is stocked, I move my focus to a different one. The 12 areas are:

- Water
- Food
- Communication
- Cooking
- First Aid

- Important Documents and Money
- Light/Power
- Safety and Security
- Sanitation
- Shelter/Warmth
- Tools and Personal Items
- Transportation and Navigation

Another fantastic way to become more prepared is to take the CERT class. During CERT training you learn about the city emergency plan and become certified to help when there

is an incident. You also train on how to “stop the bleed” and other basic first aid skills, practice using a fire extinguisher, and learn the process for search and rescue. Spring CERT classes will be on Thursday nights April 10-May 8 at City Hall for ages 16 and older. You can register here: www.bluffdale.gov/CERT.

Our HAM radio club also offers classes to help you become a licensed HAM operator. The class will be offered twice next year; in the spring on Tuesday nights from February 18-March 18 and in the fall on Thursday nights from October 2-30. Registration is not necessary. The test will be given on Saturday, March 22 and November 1. You don't have to attend the classes to take the test.

There are opportunities to join the Emergency Section Leader coalition. We need more people to join the effort to organize our neighborhoods. You can fill out a volunteer application form here: www.bluffdale.gov/Volunteer.

I strongly feel that being personally prepared is so important and grateful that the City offers these opportunities so in an emergency we will be able to work together to help each other.

CODE CORNER

Happy Holidays to all as we look forward to spending time with our families and friends. This month, the focus is on preparing for the upcoming snow season. A reminder to all: it is against city code to push snow into the street or gutters. Additionally, snow must be removed from sidewalks in front of homes and mailboxes within 24 hours after a snowstorm. The city requests that vehicles, trailers, dumpsters, and other obstructions be removed from streets during and 24 hours after a snowstorm. Vehicles and trailers left on the streets during this period may be towed, and city police officers will patrol and issue citations for violations. Some streets are narrow and it's difficult to get a plow truck through if vehicles and other items are parked on the roadway.

Before the snow arrives, residents are also reminded not to blow tree leaves into the street, as this can cause significant issues by clogging storm drains. Please do your best to pick up all leaves from your property and dispose of them properly.

Lastly, residents operating businesses from home are encouraged to obtain a city business license. The process is simple, and most licenses are free, depending on the type of business. Applications can be submitted through the city website at www.bluffdale.gov/BusinessLicense.

DO NOT PARK ON THE STREET DURING A SNOW STORM

THE POINT: CHAPEL BY THE WAYSIDE - WHY IT STILL STANDS



As The Point begins a new chapter of development, one building from the former Utah State Prison endures: the Wasatch Chapel, or Chapel by the Wayside. In 2022, the Point of the Mountain State Land Authority, after working with historic preservation groups, decided to save the chapel as a tribute to resilience and second chances. Built by inmates in response to their plea for a real chapel after a 1957 prison revolt, it was funded entirely by donations from Utahns statewide. The community's overwhelming support turned this \$130,000 project into reality, with contributions from social clubs, churches, and local events, all showcasing a collective commitment to redemption.

Since its completion in 1961, the chapel has welcomed clergy and volunteers from diverse faiths, becoming a place of peace and healing for inmates. Over decades, it grew into a sanctuary of worship, reflection, and community service, symbolizing both Utah's generosity and the inmates' craftsmanship. By preserving the Chapel by the Wayside, the Land Authority honors this legacy, giving Utahns a space to connect with their history even as the site evolves into an innovation hub. The chapel's preservation allows future generations to experience this powerful reminder of transformation, community, and hope.



Gift Safety at Home:


1. Be careful about displaying gifts where they can be seen from outside
2. Install a video doorbell
3. Track packages, require a signature, or provide a secure lock box for deliveries
4. Break down boxes of expensive gifts and put them inside your recycling bin out of site

Travel:

1. Set up a timer for your lights
2. Turn off water at fridge and toilets
3. Store valuables, cash, and car keys in a locked safe
4. Don't post about your trip online- including countdown, pictures, check-ins, etc. until you are back home. (80% of burglars used social media to find their next target)
5. Tell a neighbor or friend you will be gone so they can:
 - a. Watch over your house
 - b. Feed your pets
 - c. Collect mail, newspapers and/or packages
 - d. Shovel your driveway


Shopping:

1. Ensure you are aware of your surroundings
2. Don't carry large amounts of cash
3. Park in well-lit areas
4. Hide all gifts and/or shopping bags in your trunks (especially if you are going from store to store)
5. Lock your vehicle
6. Never leave your wallet/purse in your cart and walk away




HOLIDAY PET SAFETY TIPS

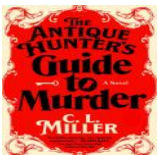
