## MAYOR'S MESSAGE

The return of the rodeo was a huge success. In my mayor's message in February 2024 I gave the history of our arena and the grant. Thank you to SLCO Council and the Tourism, Recreation and Culture Convention funding, for the ability to upgrade our bleachers and parking to become ADA compliant. Thank you to Circle J, the youth council, Lions Club, sponsors, volunteers, staff and spectators for helping to make it a wonderful event.

I am really excited for our summer celebration, Old West Days coming August 4-9. I'm also excited for a new bull riding event that will be held on the evening of September 1st. Make sure to find the July newsletter with the schedules!

These City events, along with our day-to-day living would not be possible without our Fire and Police Departments. They were all there helping and responding to various incidents and they will continue to be there for our future events. Please stop by their booths and thank them for their sacrifice and service.

I have had several people ask me



about the Bluffdale Fire & Police Protection Fund. In municipal government, we have specific funds that cannot be used for any other expenses. Think of it like a dedicated bank account that by law can only be used for that designated purpose. We

have specific funds (or accounts) for water, roads, impact fees and our fire and police.

In Utah, cities have a few different options for managing and paying for public safety. Bluffdale has never used an outside taxing district for fire or for police, but we have evolved our approach over time.

### Options for Managing Public Safety

#### 1. General Fund

Many cities, (including Bluffdale in the past) simply treat police and fire as part of their regular city departments and include them in the General Fund. Money collected from all revenue sources, including property tax, sales tax, franchise tax, etc. goes into the city's general fund, and from there, it's used for all departments and services, including public safety.

#### 2. Separate Public Safety Districts (NOT USED BY BLUFFDALE)

Some Utah communities form independent public safety districts, like the Unified Fire Authority or Unified Police Department. These entities have their own boards, their own taxing authority and operate separately from city governments. Bluffdale has never used this model because the city has chosen to keep direct control over public safety services and keep better control over the cost of service.

#### 3. Public Safety Fund Within the City (Bluffdale's Current Model)

Today, Bluffdale uses a dedicated Public Safety Fund within its city structure. We call this fund our Fire & Police Protection Fund ("FPPF"). Again, think of it like a dedicated bank account that's only used for fire and police services.

The city does not currently levy property taxes in this fund. The City Council has directed that all property taxes be transferred into this fund. By transferring them into this fund, they are specifically earmarked for public safety—and can only be spent on those services. Note that any tax increase must have a truth-in-taxation public hearing.

## Why Bluffdale's Public Safety Fund Model Stands Out

Bluffdale's Fire & Police Protection Fund offers a powerful blend of transparency, control, and accountability that sets it apart from other models. Unlike separate districts, which delegate control to outside boards with their own taxing powers (like the Unified Fire Authority or Unified Police Department), Bluffdale's fund keeps all decisions local. The city council directly oversees operations, ensuring that public safety aligns with community priorities.

Compared to housing police and fire as simple departments within the general fund, the Public Safety Fund adds a layer of fiscal clarity and protection. Property tax revenues and public safety fees that go into this fund are restricted by law—they must be spent on public safety. No dilution, no diversion. Residents know exactly where their money is going and why.

In short, Bluffdale's Fire & Police Protection Fund keeps services under the city's control, protects public safety dollars and builds trust through targeted funding. It's a smart, resident-focused way to invest in community safety. Let's continue to work together to support our fire and police departments and I hope to see everyone at our summer celebration, Old West Days!

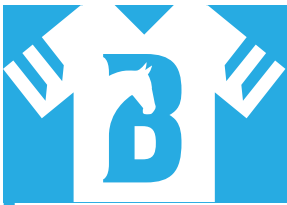

## WEST NILE VIRUS DETECTED IN MULTIPLE “MOSQUITO POOLS” IN SALT LAKE COUNTY

The Salt Lake County Health Department (SLCoHD) announced today that West Nile virus (WNV) has been detected in multiple “mosquito pools” within Salt Lake County boundaries. “Mosquito pool” is the term used for a group of mosquitoes caught and tested out of a single trap; it is not related to swimming pools or pools of water.

The mosquito pools testing positive in Salt Lake County so far this season are in Salt Lake City, including downtown and in the Sugar House neighborhood, but SLCoHD and the county’s three mosquito abatement districts expect additional mosquito pools to test positive in coming days and weeks. Because mosquitoes can travel several miles, everyone in the region—regardless of exact location—should take precautions against mosquito bites to avoid exposure to the virus. Information about mosquito pools positive for West Nile virus across Utah is available via the Utah Department of Health and Human Services website.

“There will be a growing number of mosquitoes carrying the disease,” said Mary Hill, SLCoHD epidemiology

bureau manager, “so it is now especially important that Utahns protect themselves from mosquito bites, particularly in the hours from dusk to dawn.”

Although only some mosquitoes carry WNV, there is no way for residents to tell which mosquitoes may be infected so it is important to minimize all exposure opportunities during mosquito season (which will continue until the first hard freeze):

- Use an EPA-registered mosquito repellent with DEET, permethrin, picaridin, IR3535 or oil of lemon eucalyptus; follow package directions about application.
- After dusk, wear long sleeves and pants.
- Drain standing water in yards (old tires, potted plant trays, pet dishes, toys, buckets, etc.).
- Keep roof gutters clear of debris.
- Clean and stock garden ponds with mosquito-eating fish or mosquito dunks.
- Ensure door and window screens are in good condition so mosquitoes cannot get inside.

- Keep weeds and tall grass cut short; adult mosquitoes look for these shady places to rest during the hot daylight hours.

WNV can cause mild to severe illness and many people may not even know they have been infected. It is estimated that less than 1% of people infected with WNV will develop the neuroinvasive form of the disease, which can result in debilitating long-term complications or death. Symptoms of WNV infection appear within 2 to 14 days of a mosquito bite and include fever, headache and body aches. More severe infections may include high fever, neck stiffness, disorientation, coma, tremors and muscle weakness or convulsions.

People over age 50 and people with weakened immune systems are at the highest risk of illness due to WNV, but anyone can become ill from the bite of an infected mosquito. WNV is not transmissible from person to person.

There is no specific treatment for WNV infection other than to treat symptoms. If you think you have WNV infection, contact your health care provider.

WNV was first detected in the U.S. in 1999 and in Utah in 2003. Last year, Utah health officials confirmed that 14 people in the state contracted the virus and 12 of those resulted in the neuroinvasive form of the disease. In 2024 there were no recorded deaths from WNV in Utah; one Utahn died from the disease in 2023. Because only 20–30% of infected people will have any symptoms at all—and many of those will notice only minor, flu-like symptoms—it’s likely that infection with WNV is more prevalent than the reported case numbers indicate.

## LOST & FOUND PETS: WHERE TO BEGIN

If your pet escapes from your yard, bolts out the front door, or goes missing while you're on vacation, here's where to start looking and posting.

### What to do if your pet is lost:

**Visit Shelters:** Visit your local shelter and surrounding shelters within 24 hours and keep returning. All lost pets that come into Salt Lake County Animal Services are listed at [www.adoptutahpets.org](http://www.adoptutahpets.org). Call Dispatch to report your missing pet at 801-840-4000.

**Use social media and flyers:** Post your pet's photo on social media platforms like the Next Door App, KSL, and Utah's Lost & Found Pet Facebook page.

**Search Actively:** Look for your pet during the day and at night. Call for your pet and stay in one place long enough for them to respond. Organize a search party and go door to door with lost pet flyers in the neighborhood



where your pet went missing. Place your lost pet flyers on public bulletin boards. **DON'T GIVE UP!**

### Steps to take if you find a lost pet:

**Report the Pet:** Lost pets must be reported to local animal control within 24 hours. It's the law, and a shelter is the **FIRST** place most pet owners look for their missing pet.

**Take the Pet to a Shelter:** If you find the pet in Salt Lake County Animal Services jurisdiction, take it directly to the shelter at 511 W. 3900 S. during

business hours (10 AM – 6 PM, Tues-Sat). If it's outside of business hours, call animal control dispatch at 801-840-4000. Salt Lake County Animal Control operates 24/7.

**Post Online:** Take a picture of the pet and post it on social media (e.g., Facebook, Next Door App, KSL) with details of where you found the animal and that you took it to Salt Lake County Animal Services.

**Consider Fostering:** Inquire about our Dog & Cat Foster Finder Program.

### Prepare yourself before your pet gets lost:

**ID Tags and Microchips:** Ensure your pets have current ID tags and their microchip information is up to date. All pets in Salt Lake County can receive a free microchip at Salt Lake County Animal Services at 511 W 3900 S. For questions, email [animal@saltlakecounty.gov](mailto:animal@saltlakecounty.gov).



We ♥ our dogs, but their poop - not so much!  
Scoop the poop every time!



**Dog waste is NOT fertilizer for your lawn.** In fact, it is just the opposite and can be very toxic to your soil. Due to their high-protein diet, dog waste is highly acidic and will actually burn your grass creating brown patches.



**Just one gram of dog waste can contain as many as 23 million fecal coliform bacteria.** Waste can seep into groundwater and spread salmonella and giardia. This poses a hazard to your pets, your family and your landscape.



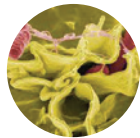
**Dog fecal matter is a major contributor to stormwater pollution.** One out of three households have at least one dog, and all that dog poop left out can be blown into storm drains, lakes, and streams. When in water, the liquefied waste consumes the oxygen and releases ammonia which contaminates our resources as well as harms the fish that reside there.



**Your lawn mower doesn't help, in fact can make it worse.** Mowers will actually chop up the waste into smaller pieces and spread it further throughout your yard where you, your children, and your pets continue to step in it and then bring it into your home.



**The EPA classified dog waste as a dangerous pollutant in the same category as toxic chemicals and oil.** The average dog discards approximately three quarters of a pound of waste per day, which adds up to 275 pounds per year. Your yard might be more polluted than you think.



**The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) confirms that hookworms, ringworms, tapeworms and Salmonella can be spread by contact with infected dog waste.** It can take over one year for dog waste to decay but even when it has visibly disappeared, the parasite eggs it contained can linger on for years in your soil - leaving your family and your pets vulnerable to serious infection.


